


## Curriculum Rationalisation

- Our pupils at KS4 have traditionally taken 10 GCSEs
- The national average is 7-8 GCSEs
- We've asked the pupils
- We've been discussing with departments following the mock exams
- Same process this year for Year 11 and it worked brilliantly for motivation and engagement
- If a subject is 'dropped' frees up time for independent study for other areas (worked into the timetable)
- You have a letter in your pack, advising of our recommendation - please sign and return the slip by Monday, if you do not we will assume that you are happy to support our recommendation

### Average number of GCSEs taken by 16-yearolds, from 2019 to 2024 — England only




# Who will be selected and how will I know if my child has been selected?










## Post-16 Study

## Choosing options – what to think about

What grades are you likely to get at GCSE?

Check the college, 6th Form, apprenticeship entry criteria

How do you like to learn e.g. by doing, by studying?

Start with what you want to do in the future - what do you need to do to get there?

Start with a Subject/s you like – focus in later

Consider location, type of establishment, and their performance and results.

There are lots of ways of getting to the same future job.




# Why this Approach?

#### Mindset Shift – it's in your hands!

- Research shows:
  - o Students often cite things like ability, luck and teacher bias as to why they can't achieve.
  - Rather than think this we shift the thinking to things they can control effort, mood, persistence
- In WIN sessions we combine high expectations with meaningful support and help students understand that success is built on strategies they can control
- We give them the confidence to keep trying, to see failure as part of learning, and to believe that success is within reach.

#### Cognitive Shift – being active not passive learners!

- Study of students actively and passively revising
- Active = Not sit and listen, but actively recall and produce answers
- Students from both control groups no difference in how prepared they felt, but the ones who engaged in active recall performed better in all types of questions – knowledge and application of the knowledge!




