### Assessment & Reporting – Yr 9 & 10

Towards the end of term, Year 9&10 will receive their first school reports of the academic year. These will include information on their progress and attitude to learning across all of their subjects.

For Year 9, there will also be information on their performance against Age Related expectations (ie, is your child working above, on or below age related expectations – this mirrors the language and approaches that you are familiar with from primary school).

For Year 10 pupils, there will also be information on their Most Likely Grades – in essence these are predicted grades based on their current work and attitude to learning.

The reports will be released prior to the Christmas break.

# Safeguarding Update: Coercive Control and Domestic Abuse Support

As part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding, we want to raise awareness about coercive control and the support available for families affected by domestic abuse.

## What is Coercive Control?

Coercive control is a pattern of behaviour used to dominate or isolate someone. It can include:

- Restricting access to friends, family, or finances
- Monitoring movements or communications
- Threats, intimidation, or emotional manipulation

These behaviours can have a serious impact on wellbeing and safety. Recognising the signs early is key to protecting those affected.
