Each week, on a Wednesday, pupils in all year groups will be set Sparx Reader, Sparx Maths and Sparx Science tasks for their home learning – these will be due in on the following Tuesday. All other subjects will set home learning in accordance with the subjects' needs – that may be consolidation of learning, research for upcoming learning or applying information in exam style questions or even extended projects. All these tasks will be set via Class Charts.

Tuesday after school will be Homework Club – this will be from 3:30-4:30 in a computer room and enable pupils to meet the weekly Sparx deadlines if they have technical issues at home.

Do you know your GAS from your GOAT? Or what it means when a young person says something “slaps” or has “drip”??

Cyber slang is the language of the digital world - a mix of acronyms, phrases, and words that children and young people use every day online. For parents, carers, and professionals, it can sometimes feel like a secret code that's hard to keep up with.

That's why we're sharing this helpful Cyber Slang Factsheet, which explains common online terms and what they mean. It's designed to help adults decode digital conversations, open up discussions, and support safer online communication.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about BEREAL

13+

Bereal is the latest trending social media app. The concept is that people use others in their outposts day-to-day lives, sharing candid photos without editing or cropping them. Each day at a random time, users are simultaneously notified to take a picture of what they're doing at that exact moment. The two-minute window to submit an image means there's no time to select particularly glamorous or exciting activity. Bereal shares two pictures: a selfie and an image of the immediate surroundings. Users can only view and react to their friends' photos once they upload their own.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- CONTINUOUS NOTIFICATIONS**
Like any social media app, Bereal's developers want users to be on it regularly and creating for long periods to avoid any social media-related anxiety. But there are other risks. The app's notification system is designed to be as intrusive as possible, with notifications arriving at random times. This can cause users to feel pressured to open the app and respond to notifications, even if they're busy or don't want to.
- CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS**
When someone signs up to Bereal, it prompts them to connect with friends. However, the app also allows users to connect with strangers. This can be risky, especially for young people who may not know how to interact with strangers online.
- PUBLIC SHARING**
As well as sharing photos with friends, the app also allows users to share photos publicly. This can be risky, especially for young people who may not know how to interact with strangers online.
- EASY LOCATION**
Bereal's default setting is to share the exact location of where a post was taken. This means that anyone who knows the location of the post can see where the user is. This can be risky, especially for young people who may not know how to interact with strangers online.
- VISIBLE PERSONAL DATA**
As with any other form of social media, Bereal allows users to share personal information. This can be risky, especially for young people who may not know how to interact with strangers online.
- REPUTATIONAL DAMAGE**
Bereal's default setting is to share the exact location of where a post was taken. This means that anyone who knows the location of the post can see where the user is. This can be risky, especially for young people who may not know how to interact with strangers online.

Advice for Parents & Carers

- LIMIT NOTIFICATIONS**
Bereal offers the option to turn off individual types of notifications. Parents and carers should encourage their children to turn off notifications that they don't want or need.
- STOP AND THINK**
Bereal's goal is to be as authentic as possible, but it's still a social media app. Parents and carers should encourage their children to think about what they're posting and how it might be perceived.
- KEEP IT AMONG FRIENDS**
Bereal's default setting is to share the exact location of where a post was taken. Parents and carers should encourage their children to only share photos with friends.
- CREATE A SAFE PROFILE**
Bereal's default setting is to share the exact location of where a post was taken. Parents and carers should encourage their children to create a safe profile.

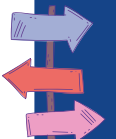
